Main functions of EJN CPs (1)

1

As active intermediaries, **facilitating judicial cooperation** between Member
States in actions to combat serious crime

2

Providing the necessary legal and practical information to enable judicial authorities to prepare an effective request for judicial cooperation or improve judicial cooperation in general

Main functions of EJN CPs (2)



In their Member States and at respective levels, promoting and being involved in the organisation of training sessions on judicial cooperation of benefit to the competent authorities

When appropriate, in cooperation with the *European Judicial Training Network*

How CPs work in practice

Operate from their offices in the Member States



 Provide know-how and assistance in issuing and executing requests for judicial cooperation

Facilitate direct contacts

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



Cooperation with Third Countries

The judicial cooperation in criminal matters between EU Member States and third countries continues to be governed by international law treaties and agreements, either bilateral or multilateral. As far as the multilateral instruments are concerned, there are, on the one hand, the legal instruments adopted under the aegis of the Council of Europe and the United Nations and, on the other hand, the Agreements that the European Union has conclued with some third countries (see the Library).

In order to facilitate the cooperation of the Member States' authorities with those from third countries, the European Judicial Network (EJN) has established close relations with the associated countries Switzerland and Norway, which have appointed Contact Points for EJN, and with the countries members of the IberRed, on the basis of a Memorandum of Understanding signed in Madrid on 21


Judicial Regional Platform of Sahel countries

The Judicial Regional Platform of Sahel countries (SAHEL, created in 2010) was created jointly by UNODC's Terrorism Prevention Branch and Organised Crime and Illicit Trafficking Branch and COI. It is a Network of focal points, who facilitate extradition and mutual legal assistance in criminal matters procedures with the



Member States. Its main objective is to prevent and combat forms of serious crime, such as organised crime, corruption, drug trafficking or terrorism. To achieve its objective, SAHEL Platform helps to strengthen judicial cooperation in criminal matters among its Member States by facilitating the transmission and execution of mutual legal assistance and extradition requests made by Member States; keeping track of the cooperation requests processed; sharing experiences and best practices; and identifying technical assistance needs.
