Nairobi, 29 July 2014 - US President Barrack Obama on Monday announced setting up of a regional leadership centre in Kenya which will be operational beginning 2015.

Three others, he announced, would also be set up in Ghana, Senegal and South Africa "in order to improve the availability and quality of leadership training programmes and professional development opportunities for young African Leaders."

Obama's announcement ironically follows the suspension of its Peace Corps programme in Kenya over security concerns.

Ceasefire in Central African Republic 'broken' with clash, rebel spokesman says

Bangui, 28 July 2014 - A spokesman for the mostly Muslim Seleka rebel group in Central African Republic says a ceasefire has been "broken" after its fighters came under attack from the mostly Christian anti-Balaka militia.

Ahmat Ibrahim Nadjad said Monday that Seleka positions came under attack Sunday near the central town of Grimari.

Thousands have died in violence between Seleka and anti-Balaka fighters in the past 16 months. The Seleka rebels seized power in 2013, but outrage over human rights abuses pressured their leader to step down in January, setting off reprisal attacks by the anti-Balaka.

The ceasefire was signed last Wednesday after three days of talks in Republic of Congo, though many doubted it would hold.

Nadjad said it should not have been signed while Muslims' security in the country remained uncertain.

China calls for enhanced peacekeeping cooperation between UN, regional organizations

United Nations, July 28 - A Chinese envoy on Monday called for enhanced peacekeeping cooperation and coordination between the United Nations and regional organizations so as to maximize their respective advantages.

Liu Jieyi, China's permanent representative to the United Nations, made the remarks here at the Security Council's open debate on regional partnership and its evolution in UN peacekeeping, which focused on the world organization's relevant cooperation with African regional groups.

S. Sudan political parties propose creation of prime minister position

Juba, July 29, 2014 - South Sudanese political parties are demanding the creation of a prime minister's position in the proposed interim government between the country's ruling party (SPLM) and its opposition wing.

The group, in a position paper, said the president and prime minister's posts shall be occupied by nominees from the rival factions of the SPLM, while the vice presidency be given to another party.

"The president and prime minister shall, respectively, be from the Sudan People's Liberation Movement in government (SPLM IG and the Sudan People's Liberation Movement in Opposition (SPLM-IO). The vice-president shall be from the political parties other than the two mentioned above," partly reads the position paper obtained by *Sudan Tribune*.

Sudan Hit by Heavy Rains, Floods

28 July 2014 - Sudan - One citizen died, and 12 others were injured in the northern Sudanese River Nile State due to heavy rains last week. Torrential rains also caused severe damages to dozens of houses in localities of Shendi, Matamma, Damer, and Berber.

In South Kordofan, the El Obeid-Kadugli road was blocked, and the railway bridge in the area of El Hammadi was demolished owing to the heavy rainfalls and the ensuing floods.

The Kassala State government is taking measures to protect Kassala town from flooding.

Citizens in Khartoum complained about the damage caused by the downpours on Friday. They severely criticised State Governor Abdel Rahman El Khidir for not taking any precautionary measures for the current rainy season.
