Plenary Session: Stocktaking on the implementation of the ICGLR Regional Initiative on Natural Resources to combat the illegal exploitation of natural resources in the Great Lakes Region: progress, challenges, and ways to improve the effectiveness of the RINR and in particular the implementation of the Gold Strategy.

Introduction: Following the signing, in December 2006, of the Protocol against the Illegal Exploitation of Natural Resources as part and parcel of the Pact on Security, Stability and Development in the Great Lakes Region, Heads of State and Government of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region adopted, in December 2010 in Lusaka, Zambia, the Six Tools of the Regional Initiative on the Fight against the Illegal Exploitation of Natural Resources (RINR). Through the Lusaka Declaration, Heads of State of Government directed the relevant institutions in Member States to implement the six tools, particularly the Regional Certification Mechanism which has been developed for the monitoring and control of the exploitation and trade of natural resources in the Great Lakes Region in a bid to undercutting the link between financing of armed groups and mineral exploitation and trade.

Introduced by a short presentation of the Office of the Special Envoy of the UN Secretary General for the Great Lakes Region, the session will take stock of the status of implementation of the Six Tools of the RINR, ten years after their adoption.

Overcoming challenges of mineral due diligence implementation.

Introduction: Due diligence has become the global responsible business norm. In the mineral sector, the Great Lakes Region is the pioneer of implementation of due diligence programmes through the **ICGLR** Regional Certification Mechanism and the OECD Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas. However, mineral due diligence actors still report on various challenges that are yet to be surmounted. A number or research papers or investigations still report no or limited impact of due diligence programmes on the livelihoods, physical security and human rights in mining communities. This session will discuss challenges related to mineral due

Addressing cross-border illicit mineral trade and financial flow.

Introduction: Cross-border illicit mineral trade is depriving the governments of the region of important revenues that are needed to provide public services and boost economic development. One cause for this issue is that the current legal and fiscal regimes of the countries are not set up to support regional trade and value addition. Bureaucratic and financial obstacles cause mining companies and trading houses to avoid regional trade as it is very costly and time-consuming and the framework is often unclear. This hampers value addition through the refineries and smelters, perpetuating the predominant structures where much of the region's wealth is shipped out of the continent for processing with minimal local value addition. We would therefore like to use this break-out session to discuss how the regional stakeholders can work together to facilitate
